Probationary Scheme for Newly Qualified Drivers

To insert an additional proposition between propositions 6 and 7 as follows:

“6A. To agree that when a person has been convicted of any road traffic offence committed during any period when P-plates were required to be “kept in place” in accordance with the legislation to give effect to proposition 1 the court sentencing him in respect of that offence shall have power, in addition to any other sentence (including an order of disqualification for a fixed period) which the court has power to impose (and without prejudice to any other statutory provision then in force), to disqualify that person from holding a driving licence of any or any specified category until he shall have passed, since the date of that order, a test of competence to drive prescribed under the Motor Taxation and Licensing (Guernsey) Law 1987.”.
