

Urgent Newsflash: Ciprofloxacin

- Please be aware that in our local guidelines the only first-line indication for Ciprofloxacin is acute prostatitis.
- ♣ Ciprofloxacin should never be prescribed in primary care without prior microbiological advice for common infections such as urinary tract infections, respiratory tract infections and travellers' diarrhoea.
 - ♣ Ciprofloxacin, as well as Co-Amoxiclav and the Cephalosporins (The "three Cs") are the antibiotics most likely to be implicated in the development of C Difficile.
- ♣ There were fifteen cases of C Diff in the Bailiwick last year, all as a result of broad spectrum antibiotics.
- At the request of the visiting Microbiologists, HSSD are likely to request an audit in Primary Care of Ciprofloxacin prescribing in 2014.
 - Attached is a snapshot of Guernsey Primary Care prescribing in the year to September 2013.
 - ♣ Prescribers are earnestly requested to seek microbiological advice on 725241 for patients being considered for ciprofloxacin prescribing in the coming weeks and months.
