## The Control of Poisonous Substances (Guernsey) (Amendment) Regulations, 2016

Made	4 <sup>th</sup> February, 2016
Laid before the States	2016

THE STATES OF GUERNSEY COMMERCE AND EMPLOYMENT DEPARTMENT, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 1 and 4 of the Poisonous Substances (Guernsey) Law, 1994<sup>a</sup>, hereby makes the following regulations:-

# Amendment of the Control of Poisonous Substances (Guernsey) Regulations, 2014.

 The Control of Poisonous Substances (Guernsey) Regulations, 2014<sup>b</sup> are amended as follows –

- (a) in Schedule 3 to those Regulations
  - (i) delete the word "and" at the end of subparagraph (c) of paragraph 2, and
  - (ii) for subparagraph (d) of paragraph 2, substitute the following subparagraphs –
    - "(d) hold a certificate of competence for the use of poisonous substances, and

- (e) obtain a new certificate of competence, or renew his certificate of competence, for the use of poisonous substances at least once every 5 years from the date on which the certificate of competence was issued.", and
- (b) in Schedule 5 to those Regulations, between paragraphs 3 and 4, insert the following paragraphs
  - "3A. A certificate of competence recognised by the Department under the 1995 Regulations and valid immediately before the commencement of these Regulations is to be regarded as a certificate of competence for the purposes of these Regulations until the expiry of the later of the following dates-
    - (a) the  $31^{st}$  August, 2017, or
    - (b) the 5<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the date when the certificate of competence was issued.
  - 3B. Paragraph 2(e) of Schedule 3 has no effect before the 1<sup>st</sup> September, 2017.".

#### Interpretation.

2. (1) In these regulations, unless the context requires otherwise –

"enactment" means any Law, Ordinance or subordinate legislation, and

"subordinate legislation" means any regulation, rule, order, rule of court, resolution, scheme, byelaw or other instrument made under any enactment and having legislative effect.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948<sup>c</sup> applies to the interpretation of these regulations.

(3) Any reference in these regulations to an enactment is a reference thereto as from time to time amended, re-enacted (with or without modification), extended and applied.

**3**. These Regulations may be cited as the Control of Poisonous Substances (Guernsey) (Amendment) Regulations, 2016.

#### Commencement.

4. These Regulations come into force on the  $5^{th}$  day of February, 2016.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the regulations)

These Regulations make transitional provisions relating to the commencement of the the Control of Poisonous Substances (Guernsey) Regulations, 2014 ("**principal Regulations**".

A provision of the principal Regulations required professional users of poisonous substances to obtain a new certificate of competence, or renew their certificates every 5 years. However, a suitable competence scheme for the use of poisonous substances is not expected to be established on the island of Guernsey, and the relevant certificates are not expected to be issued, until 2017.

In light of this, it is considered appropriate to postpone the implementation of this requirement until 1<sup>st</sup> September, 2017. In the meantime any certificate of competence recognised under the previous Control of Poisonous Substances Regulations, 1995 will continue to be regarded as a valid certificate of competence until that date, or the expiry of 5 years from the date on which the certificate was issued, whichever is the later.

These Regulations will come into force on the 5<sup>th</sup> February, 2016.
