

At the Princess Elizabeth Hospital, we have three in-patient surgical wards within a surgical unit, including a private wing.

The Surgical Ward holds general surgical beds, providing care for patients undergoing vascular, gastrointestinal, colorectal, urological, ear, nose and throat, breast and some ophthalmic procedures. Gynaecology is shared between Surgical and Victoria Wing.

Orthopaedics provides care for patients requiring orthopaedic procedures, both elective and trauma.

Victoria Wing offers private patient care facilities. The ward caters for surgical patients as above and medical patients with cardiac, respiratory, renal, liver, gastrointestinal, endocrinology, neurological and cancer related illnesses. There are also two rooms which cater for infection control purposes.

Nursing staff on the wards form part of multi-disciplinary teams that include medical specialists, therapists, and a wide range of specialist and consultant nurses who work across acute services which include pain management, infection control, diabetes, breast care, urology, stoma care and osteoporosis. There is also liaison with discharge nurses and staff in the community teams.
