

## Access to Public Information Response

### REQUEST UNDER THE CODE OF PRACTICE FOR ACCESS TO PUBLIC INFORMATION

Request sent on December 29<sup>th</sup> 2017:

I would like to receive designs that were made for (possible) use on Guernsey coins but were eventually not used on such coins. This for example because other designs were chosen or the planned issuance of the particular coin was cancelled.

This information is being requested under the Code of Practice for Access to Public Information.

States of Guernsey response sent on January 2<sup>nd</sup> 2018:

Thank you for your request made under the States of Guernsey's Code of Practice on Access to Public Information. Please see the below response from Central Services.

Please be advised that the States of Guernsey circulating coin (£1 down to 1p) hasn't been changed since 1985. Due to the length of time that has elapsed since these coins were issued, we are unaware of any rejected designs, or indeed if there were any other proposals considered at that time. For your information there are currently no plans to change our circulating coin designs.

In terms of any commemorative coins issued, this is done in partnership with Westminster Collection, who are responsible for the design of the coins and continue to own the intellectual property rights of these. It is therefore not possible for the States of Guernsey to release any information relating to commemorative coin proposals.
