- Focuses on educational outcomes, not buildings
- Captures the best of all-ability education
- Widest possible range of curriculum opportunities for students but same class sizes as in Committee's proposals
- Teachers able to work across all key stages
- Size of schools in line with highest-attaining comprehensives nationally and supported by relevant evidence
- Retains 11-18 offer in the States' sector
- Stronger collaboration between the 11-18 School and the College of F.E.
- Vocational and technical education in a single, integrated College of F.E.
- Consistent with national developments in technical education
- Commitment to devolve governance and leadership away from the Education 'centre' down to School and College
- Commitment to replace the outdated 1970 Education Law

Committee *for* Education, Sport & Culture proposals

- Schools of vastly different size one is 60% larger than another
- Based on policy on school size which is totally unsupported by relevant evidence
- No 11-18 offer in the States' sector leaving this to the grant-aided Colleges only
- Denies teachers the chance to work across the key stages
- Divides vocational and technical education into different colleges
- × Partitions the College of F.E. cuts it in two
- Denies lecturers the chance to practise across all phases of their discipline
- Unorthodox post-16 proposals which have little professional support
- No commitment to devolve governance and leadership away from the Education 'centre' to schools and colleges
- No commitment to replace the outdated 1970 Education Law
