REQUEST UNDER THE CODE OF PRACTICE FOR ACCESS TO PUBLIC INFORMATION

Request sent on March 16th 2018:

Could I please make a formal request under the Code of Practice on Access to Public Information.

Could you please provide a breakdown of tenders/purchases that the States of Guernsey have made over the last five years. This can be limited to tenders with total contract values over £10,000. In addition I would like to how many companies submitted a bid, how many of those were, had headquarters in Guernsey, who won, and if they had their headquarters in Guernsey. Please could you respond in the table format as below.

In addition I would like to know if the States of Guernsey have any policy towards awarding contracts to Guernsey based businesses over non-Guernsey based businesses and if so what that is. This could be either a overarching policy or a policy that is applied to any of the specific tenders referred to above.

We are conscious that the attached does not meet the criteria and format you requested. While we always seek to fully meet requests for information wherever possible, on this occasion doing so would have required staff going through each tender individually in order to find the detail requested. As we're sure can be appreciated, given the number of tenders in the last five years it would have taken a substantial amount of time to carry out this work, and would have diverted staff resources away from their core responsibilities in the process. As such a decision was taken that such action would not represent value for money for taxpayers.

The detail we were able to source from the portal provides an overview of all tenders conducted by the States of Guernsey during the last five years, and we hope you find this of use.
