### REQUEST UNDER THE CODE OF PRACTICE FOR ACCESS TO PUBLIC INFORMATION

Request sent on March 20<sup>th</sup> 2018:

Request One: The number of school age children that there are in each school year across the island, ideally by gender

Purpose: to establish whether the proportion of young people in scouting is changing, not just the absolute numbers (which I have)

Request Two: The number of school age children/ young adults that live in the following States owned properties/ areas of the island: Les Genats Estate, Le Grand Bouet, Pre De L'Aumone Estate, Pre De Quartier, Mont Marche Estate, Les Naftiaux, Le Jehannet Estate, Route des Coutures, Le Hurel Estate, Sausmarez Mill Estate, Millbrook Housing Estate, Clos de Mont Arrive, La Vrangue Estate, Rougeval Housing Estate, Courtil St. Jacques Housing Estate, Valnord Estate, Clairval Estate, Courtil Bris and Couture Clos, Mauhaut Gardens and Collings Road, Rodley Park, Clos de Bordage, Sandy Hook Estate, Bas Courtils Estate, Les Islets Estate, Courtil Michele, Sous Les Hougues, Rue Flere Estate, Courtil Le Clement, Clos de Figuier, Summerville and Pont Vaillant, Le Picquerel Estate
