Antigua and Barbuda; Australia; The Bahamas; Barbados; Belize; Canada; Dominica; Grenada; Guyana; Jamaica; New Zealand; St Kitts and Nevis; St Lucia; St Vincent and the Grenadines; Trinidad and Tobago; United States of America

Appendix 2 – Majority English speaking countries – Academic Qualifications

If you hold an academic qualification equivalent to a Bachelor's degree in the UK which was taught in English, you will not be required to take the English Language test.

Where the academic qualification was taught in one of the majority English speaking countries listed below we will assume it to have been taught in English:

Antigua and Barbuda; Australia; The Bahamas; Barbados; Belize; Dominica; Grenada; Guyana; Jamaica; New Zealand; St Kitts and Nevis; St Lucia; St Vincent and the Grenadines; Trinidad and Tobago; the UK; United States of America.

Appendix 3 – Academic qualifications taught in English

Academic qualifications taught in countries other than the UK and the designated English speaking countries listed above may also be accepted if you are able to provide evidence to show that the qualification was taught in English and that it is recognised by the National Academic Recognition Information Centre for the UK (UK NARIC) as equivalent to a UK Bachelor's degree.

Qualifications awarded outside of the UK must be recognised by the UK NARIC as equivalent to a UK Bachelor's degree. You must provide a letter from UK NARIC stating that your qualification meets this standard.

Master's degrees and PhD's will only be acceptable if recognised by UK NARIC. Evidence of this will be required. If UK NARIC cannot confirm the equivalence of

your qualification you will not be able to use it to meet the English language requirement.

If you apply for leave to enter or remain your application will be refused without any refund of the statutory application fee.
