### **Question 1**

Power station generators are causing health concerns among St Sampson's residents and fears are increasing that the effect of emissions are having a detrimental impact upon health across the Island. Significant health matters are a product of a particulate matter and dioxine emissions. EU standards require proper filters and scrubbers to remove fly ash. Have these been fitted at the Power Station during recent major upgrades and if not why not?

### **Question 2**

GE has the responsibility to model and monitor emission discharges. This information is considered in relation to the impact on ambient air quality locally. What is measured and monitored by GE and to what extent do the results comply with UK DEFRA standards.
