Request for Public Information: ARUP and Secondary transition

## **Request for information:**

I'd like to request some information under the code for Access to Information.

Firstly, I'd like to find out how much money was spent by the States of Guernsey commissioning ARUP for the traffic impact assessment around the new Lisia School.

And what information were ARUP provided with by the States of Guernsey regarding the layout of the island's traffic infrastructure?

Secondly, I'd like to find out how much money has been spent by the States of Guernsey on the education transition project since February 2018?

## Response: (provided by the Office of the Committee for Education, Sport & Culture)

Total spent by the States of Guernsey commissioning ARUP for the traffic impact assessment of Les Beacamps High School and St Sampson's High School sites:

£58,515

ARUP were provided with the following information regarding the layout of the island's traffic infrastructure:

- Detailed OS mapping for the agreed study area of each site, including all offsite junctions;
- Relevant legislation and design guidance including the Traffic Engineering Guidelines for Guernsey (2001) which sets out the Traffic Management Road Hierarchy;
- Access Strategy, prepared by the previous transport consultant WSP, which included detailed baseline reviews of the transport infrastructure in the vicinity of both sites and the results of a travel survey;
- A summary of scheduled road works that had been undertaken at the time of the traffic count surveys;

- Site photos of all junctions within the study area, complimenting the photos collected during the site visits undertaken by Arup; and
- Traffic count data, traffic signal specifications and Road Traffic Collision reports.

Total spent by the States of Guernsey on the Education Transformation Programme since February 2018:
