

Guidance Notes on Sales of alcohol to takeaway when holding a Category 'A', Category 'C' and Category 'E' licence

Am I allowed to sell alcohol to takeaway and be consumed outside of my premises?

Sale of alcohol to be consumed outside premises as a takeaway is not allowed.

Sale of alcohol as part of a food takeaway order is allowed as long as the amount of alcohol is reasonable and ancillary to the sale of food.

It will not be considered reasonable to provide a case of beer with a food delivery but the sale of one or two bottles of beer or wine will be considered as acceptable.

What do I need to do if I want to only sell alcohol as a takeaway or operate an off-licence?

An application to the Royal Court for a Category 'I' ('Off-Licence') Licence will be required if you wish to make the sale of alcohol to take away become an integral part of your business.

Is there any restriction on the delivery of alcohol as part of a food takeaway order?

In addition to the sale of alcohol been ancillary to the food order, it is to be noted that delivery of alcohol should only be handed to person over the age of 18 and proof of age should be provided.
