Jobseekers with some work	506	FEWER PEOPLE CLAIMING A TOP-UP There were also 506 people jobseeking and doing some work. This number includes people in part-time or casual employment. This compares with 552 in the previous month and 407 in February 2020. Of those people who had some work, there were 274 people registered as female and 232 registered as male. This means there were 42 more women receiving a top-up.																												
New Claims	614	INCREASE IN NEW CLAIMS During February 2021 614 jobseekers made new claims. This compares with 490 in the previous month and 47 in February 2020.																												
Job Adverts	101	ADVERTISING The Job Centre promoted 101 adverts on its website and display boards this month. In February 2020 there were 318.																												
Alderney	12	JOBSEEKERS IN ALDERNEY The number of jobseekers in Alderney was 12. This compares with 12 for the last month and 10 for February 2020.																												
Distribution without work	M-583 F-417	DISTRIBUTION OF CLAIMS BY REGISTERED SEX Of those people who had no work, there were 583 people registered as male and 417 registered as female. This means there were 166 more men registered as wholly unemployed.
