



Temporary structure permit

If you need to put a temporary structure on a footpath, road or verge interacting with a public highway you will need a permit.


It allows us to:

- Ensure that the temporary structure is erected in accordance with health and safety legislation.
- Be aware of the temporary structure so members of the public can be notified.
- Ensure that the safety of the public and operatives working in and around the area on the public highway are protected at all times.

Conditions

A permit only covers one temporary structure. If you intend to erect multiple temporary structures you will need separate permits. If you need two or more temporary structures at the same location, two permits will be required.

You may need a traffic management plan, if this is likely to cause an obstruction to a public highway/road, road closure or obstruct parking spaces. You also need to determine whether listed building consent is required.

Anyone wishing to undertake any works or obstruct the Public Highway requires a permit. To obtain a permit, please complete the  [Road Works - Application Form \[370kb\]](#).

What you need to know before you apply?

We reserve the right to refuse an application based on temporary structure content.

You are responsible for placing the temporary structure safely and securely. You must secure a temporary structure using suitable fixings. Temporary structures that are not secured safely will be removed.

Once the relevant permissions, plans, orders and insurances are in place you can apply for your permit.

You will need the following before you can submit your application:

- a completed a risk assessment including a design plan and tie methods (where applicable)
- a traffic management plan (where applicable)
- evidence of listed building consent (where applicable)
- Public Liability Insurance details

For all temporary structure permit applications, a site meeting may be required in order to record and agree the condition of the site prior to works being undertaken.

How much does it cost and what happens next?

A permit costs £41. Each permit should be applied for at least 7 days in advance of planned start date of erection.

Once your application has been submitted and we have all the information required to process your application, your permit will be issued to you in around five working days. If anything is missing we will contact you.
