

<u>Special import arrangements for animals and goods entering the Bailiwick</u> directly from relevant third countries

Regulated Sanitary & Phyto-sanitary (SPS) goods imported directly from relevant third countries (France) must be pre-notified in writing to the Office of Environmental Health and Pollution Regulation.

Provide the information below by email with 'SPS notification' as the subject line to envhealth@gov.gg

The notification can be made as soon as the information is available, but must be made at least **24 hours** in advance of the goods arriving in the Bailiwick.

Attach the SPS notification email to GEMS to demonstrate that you have made the legally required notification. Failure to attach the email to GEMS may result in your goods being delayed at the border.

Any health certificates, phyto-sanitary certificates, other official documents or attestations, or any other supporting documentation should also be attached to the SPS notification email.
