

PUBLIC SERVICLE VEHICLE (PSV) PERMIT – TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Permits to drive Public Service Vehicles are issued under the Road Traffic (Permits to Drive Public Service Vehicles) Ordinance, 1986 and are subject to the following conditions approved by the Committee *for the* Environment and Infrastructure:

Enhanced Convictions Check

In order for your permit to remain valid, you must be in possession of a valid DBS certificate that has been cleared by staff.

The date for the renewal of your DBS is stated on the reverse of your PSV permit. It is strongly recommended that you reapply for your DBS at least two months prior to the renewal date to ensure you receive clearance in time.

In the event that you are convicted or cautioned for any criminal or motoring offence, whether in Guernsey or another jurisdiction, you must notify Driver & Vehicle Licensing a soon as possible and within fourteen days following the date of the conviction or caution. Your notice must include details of the conviction or caution including when and where the offence took place together with the penalty imposed by the court if applicable. Failure to comply with this condition may result in the withdrawal of your Permit to Drive a Public Service Vehicle.

Failure to receive DBS clearance prior to the renewal date or to notify Passenger Transport of a criminal or motoring offence will result in the PSV Permit being temporary suspended or revoked.

Medical fitness

For your permit to remain valid, you must remain medically fit to drive a Public Service Vehicle.

You must have your next 'Group 2' Medical Report cleared by passenger transport prior to the medical date stated on the reverse of your PSV permit. Your medical can be undertaken up to 4 months prior to the renewal date and we would strongly recommend submitting this at least 1 month prior to the renewal date to ensure you receive clearance.

You must notify Driver and Vehicle Licensing of any medical condition, or change to an existing medical condition, that may affect your driving AT ANY TIME whilst you hold a PSV permit.

Failure to receive clearance prior to the medical renewal date will result in the PSV Permit being temporary suspended or revoked.

Change of Details

If you change your name or address, you must notify Passenger Transport within 30 days by email: passengertransport@gov.gg or in writing to: Passenger Transport, Driver and Vehicle Licensing, Edward T Wheadon House, Le Truchot, St Peter Port, GY1 3WH.

Failure to notify Passenger Transport of a change of details may result in your PSV Permit being suspended or revoked.
