

STATUTORY INSTRUMENTS LAID BEFORE THE STATES

The States of Deliberation have the power to annul the Statutory Instruments detailed below.

No. 178 of 2021

THE FINANCIAL SERVICES COMMISSION (BAILIWICK OF GUERNSEY) LAW, 1987 (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 2021 (COMMENCEMENT) REGULATIONS, 2021

In pursuance of section 4 of the Financial Services Commission (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1987 (Amendment) Ordinance, 2021, " Financial Services Commission (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1987 (Amendment) Ordinance, 2021 (Commencement) Regulations, 2021" made by the Policy & Resources Committee on 16th March, 2021, are laid before the States.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

These Regulations bring into force the Financial Services Commission (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1987 (Amendment) Ordinance, 2021 on 22nd March, 2021.

THE PLANT HEALTH (PRESERVED PHYTOSANITARY CONDITIONS REGULATION (AMENDMENT) (GUERNSEY) REGULATIONS, 2022

In exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 108 of Reserved Regulation 2016/2031 of the European Parliament and of the Council on protective measures against plants and pests, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf "The Plant Health (Preserved Phytosanitary Conditions Regulation) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Regulations, 2022" made by the Committee for the Environment and Infrastructure on 7th March 2022, are laid before the States.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

These Regulations make further amendments to the Preserved Phytosanitary Conditions Regulation which has effect in Guernsey as preserved EU law.

The amendments are made to align with amendments made in Great Britain, as, from the end of 2020, Guernsey has been part of a Great Britain and Crown Dependency market in plants and plant products.

Part I of the Regulations amends the Preserved Phytosanitary Conditions Regulation to include pest measures which require urgent implementation and are therefore subject to an earlier implementation date of 7th March 2022. The Part includes measures to prevent the introduction of plant pests *Polygraphus Proximus* and *Scolytus morawitzi* in Guernsey, including a prohibition, pending a risk assessment, on the introduction of the hosts of these pests *Abies*, *Pinus*, *Larix*, and *Tsuga* origination from Russia.

Thaumetopoea processionea (oak processionary moth) is removed as a Pest Free Area (PFA) quarantine pest in Guernsey to reflect amendments made in Great Britain. Oak processionary

moth is instead included in Annex 2 of the Phytosanitary Conditions Regulation as a Guernsey quarantine pest which is not known to occur in Guernsey. In Great Britain it is also included in the equivalent Annex 2 but as a pest that is known to occur following outbreaks in England. The following pests which no longer pose a risk to biodiversity in Guernsey are also deregulated: *Aonidiella orientalis* and *Diaporthe caulivora*.

Part II of the Regulations amend the Phytosanitary Conditions Regulation to include additional pest measures which do not require urgent implementation and are subject to a later commencement date of 8th August 2022. These include adding the following provisional Guernsey quarantine pests to the Guernsey quarantine pest list: *Eotetranychus sexmaculatus* and *Platypus apicalis*. The following pests are added to the provisional GB quarantine pest list for the first time: *Agrilus horni*, *Chrysobothris femorata*, *Lycorma delicatula*, *Diaporthe phaseolorum* var. *sojae*, *Pseudomonas avellanae*, *Meloidogyne arenaria*, *Meloidogyne enterolobii*, *Meloidogyne javanica*, *Xiphinema index* and *Chilli veinal mottle virus*. Updates are also made to the import requirements for *Bemisia tabaci*, *Liriomyza huidobrensis* and *Liriomyza tiliifolia*, *Cronartium spp.* and *Spodoptera frugiperda*.

Parts I and III of these Regulations shall come into force on 7th March 2022 and Part II on 8th August 2022.

THE LIQUOR LICENSING (FEES) REGULATIONS, 2022

In pursuance of sections section 84(4) of the Liquor Licensing Ordinance 2006, The Liquor Licensing (Fees) Regulations, 2022, made by the Committee for Home Affairs on 21st March 2022, is laid before the States.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Regulations amend Schedule 4 of the Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 2006 which sets the relevant fees for liquor licences etc.

These Regulations come into force on 1st June 2022.

THE ROAD TRAFFIC (DISABLED PERSONS) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 2022

In pursuance of sections 2A(1) and 2B of the Motor Taxation and Licensing (Guernsey) Law, 1987, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, "The Road Traffic (Disabled Persons) (Amendment) Regulations, 2022" made by the Committee for the Environment and Infrastructure on 21st March, 2022 are laid before the States.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Regulations amend the Road Traffic (Disabled Persons) Ordinance, 1991 so as to clarify that the driver of a mobility scooter (described as an "invalid carriage") which complies with

the specifications set out in that Ordinance does not require a driving licence in order to drive it on the public highway.

These Regulations came into force on the 25th day of March, 2022
