Can you please provide me with the following information relating to persons in the Bailiwick of Guernsey:

- The number of miscarriages in the first, second or third trimester* in 2021
- The number of miscarriages in the first, second or third trimester* 2020, 2019, 2018, 2017 respectively
- The total number of preterm births in 2021
- The total number of preterm births for the years 2020, 2019, 2018, 2017 respectively
- The total number of off island hospital transfer admissions for preterm births and babies up to 3 months of age in 2021
- The total number of off island hospital transfer admissions for preterm births and babies up to 3 months of age in 2020, 2019, 2018, 2017 respectively
- The number of Cardiac arrests call outs responded to by the Guernsey ambulance service throughout 2021 (numbers breakdown by month), and annual numbers for 2020, 2019, 2018 and 2017
