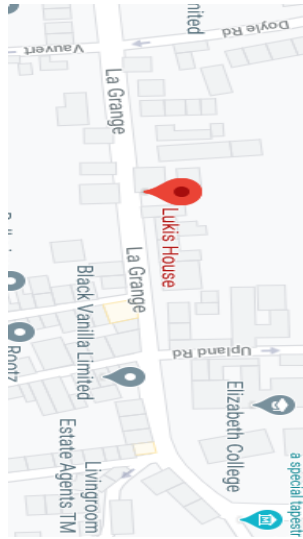

ABOUT OUR SERVICE



Every family with children has a Health Visitor until their child starts primary school.

Health Visitors are qualified Nurses or Midwives with special training and experience in health improvement.

Their role is to work with you to understand any health needs you, your child or family may have and to plan and provide services which support you. We follow the Healthy Child Programme (DOH, 2011) which offers four tiers of support.

Your Health Visitor will offer support and information from pregnancy, birth and through your child's early years.

Your Midwife will issue you with your Personal Child Health Record (PCHR) commonly known as the red book.



UNIVERSAL SERVICE

- **Antenatal Contact** .
- **New Birth Visit** when your baby is 10—14 days old.
- **A 6 - 8 weeks** Home visit or appointment.
- **An Invitation** to attend a Postnatal Group at 8 weeks onwards.
- **A 4 - 5 Month invite to a group weaning session** to discuss introducing solids.
- **A 9 - 12 Month Review** of your baby's health and development.
- **A 2 - 2½Year Review** of your baby's health and development.
- **A 3½ - 4 year appointment** for your child to have weight and height measured and pre-school immunisations. At this time, the Orthoptist will also contact you separately to arrange for your child to have an eye check.



UNIVERSAL PLUS SERVICE

At times during your child's life, you may need extra support. Remember that if you want to ask something you can always phone your Health Visitor. Contact details are on the inside of your child's 'My Personal Child Health Record' (red book).

The Health Visiting Service also offers:

- Advice on child's growth and development.
- Support for children with special needs.
- Advice on common infections in childhood, common skin problems and allergies.
- Information about childhood immunisations.
- Help with behaviour, toilet training, sleep and eating issues.
- Breast feeding, weaning, healthy eating, hygiene, safety and exercise.
- Support for specific issues such as postnatal depression, bereavement and domestic abuse.
- Information about other services and groups, for example, breast feeding support, Incredible Years, Mellow Parenting, Parent & Toddlers groups.



We are able to refer to specialist services, for example:-

- Speech & Language Therapy
- Audiologists
- Orthoptists
- Paediatricians
- Dieticians
