TO THE MEMBERS OF THE STATES OF ELECTION OF THE ISLAND OF GUERNSEY

I have the honour to inform you that a Meeting of the States of Election will be held at the **THE ROYAL COURT HOUSE**, on **WEDNESDAY**, the **26th January**, **2000**, at 10.00 a.m., for the purpose of electing a Jurat in the place of Leonard Arthur Moss, Esquire, OBE, who, under the operation of subsection (1) of section 5 of the Royal Court of Guernsey (Miscellaneous Reform Provisions) Law, 1950, ceased to hold office by reason of age on the 4th December, 1999.

Nominations must be in writing (suitable forms are available at my office on request) and must be made and seconded by a Member of the States of Election or by a Douzenier and must reach me by 4 p.m. on the 10th January, 2000. A nomination must be accompanied by a certificate in writing, signed by the candidate, stating his or her willingness to serve in the office of Jurat if elected.

I remind you that, for the purpose of the election of a Jurat, the States of Election is composed of the following:—

The Bailiff
The Jurats
The Conseillers
The Rectors (subject to the provisions of the Reform (Amendment)
(Guernsey) Law, 1984)
H.M. Procureur
H.M. Comptroller
The People's Deputies

The ten Douzaine Representatives who sit in the States of Deliberation together with twenty-four additional Douzaine Representatives elected for a particular meeting of the States of Election by their respective Douzaines, as follows:—

From St. Peter Port, eight. From St. Sampson, four. From the Vale, five. From the Castel, four. From St. Martin, three.

Will the Constables of the five last mentioned Parishes kindly convene their respective Douzaines for the purpose of electing for the Meeting of the 26th January, the appropriate number of additional Douzaine Representatives and deliver to Her Majesty's Greffier not later than 3 p.m. on the 25th January, 2000, a certificate, signed by the Constables as to the Douzaine Representatives to be elected.

Notice of nominations, as they are received, will be posted in the lobby of the Royal Court and, when the period for receiving nominations has expired, a further notice concerning all those received will be published in "La Gazette Officielle".
