Social Security Department – Overview of Responsibilities

The Department maintains and develops:

- The **collection of Social Security contributions** for the exclusive use in the provision of Social Security Benefits;
- A contributory Social Insurance Scheme to provide financial assistance to the community through the administration of old age pension, bereavement benefits, sickness and invalidity benefits, industrial injuries benefits, medical travel grants, unemployment benefit, maternity benefits and a death grant;
- A **contributory Health Insurance Scheme** to cover prescriptions charges, specialist medical care and GP and nurse consultation grants;
- A **contributory Long-term Care Insurance Scheme** to provide long-term care benefit to assist with the cost of accommodation and care in private nursing and private residential homes;
- Non-contributory schemes to provide family allowance, severe disability benefit and carer's allowance and supplementary benefit to people unable to safeguard their own welfare or having insufficient resources for an adequate quality of life;
- **Reciprocal agreements** with other countries to preserve the social insurance entitlements for local residents working in the international community and vice versa.
