FOREWORD

The Census of Population was taken on the night of 23rd March 1986, and was conducted by officers of the States Advisory and Finance Committee under powers conferred by "The Census Ordinance, 1986". The States Supervisor, F N Le Cheminant, B.Sc(Econ), F.C.I.S., served as Chief Registrar, and the Head, Economics and Statistics, J W Dickson, Ph.D., B.Sc., as the Census Supervisor.

The Census Report has been prepared for the Chief Registrar by the Census Supervisor. In presenting the report to the Population and Migration Committee the Chief Registrar has discharged himself of the responsibilities conferred upon him by the Ordinance. The Committee in its turn has discharged its responsibilities by transmitting a copy of this Report to the President of the States of Guernsey for the information of States Members.

The statistical analysis of the Census returns has been conducted by Applied Statistics Research Unit of the University of Kent at Canterbury.

The Committee wishes to acknowledge the co-operation it has received from the public and from States departments during the taking of the Census. It also wishes to record its appreciation for the help that has been afforded by the United Kingdom Office of Population, Censuses and Surveys.

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GENERAL EXPLANATORY NOTES

1. Census Night Population

All persons in Guernsey, Herm, Jethou or Lihou at midnight 23/24 March 1986, irrespective of nationality or normal place of residence (i.e. inclusive of visitors and exclusive of residents absent from the Islands), including persons on board vessels moored in the harbours or marinas.

2. Resident Population

All persons resident in Guernsey, Herm, Jethou or Lihou at midnight 23/24 March, 1986, whether present in, or temporarily absent from the Islands at that time. the 1986 Census statistics relate to this Resident Population.

3. 1976 and Earlier Census Figures

No changes have been made since 1976 in the boundaries of Civil Parishes. However, the figures for Censuses prior to 1976 included visitors and excluded residents who were temporarily absent from the Islands on Census night. This difference must be allowed for in making comparisons.

4. Schedules

A copy of the main schedules used in Guernsey is attached as Appendix to this report.

5. Definitions, etc.

Dwelling, structurally separate

A building containing residential accommodation with access from outside. (For example, a block of flats with a common entrance is regarded as one dwelling, but a building converted into two flats each with an outside entrance would be regarded as two dwellings).

Room

An interior portion of a dwelling divided off by walls, or sliding or fixed partitions; other than a kitchen less than six feet wide, a bathroom, a toilet, a scullery not used for cooking, a closet, a pantry, a storeroom, a landing, a hall, a lobby, a recess, or an office or shop used solely for business purposes.

Household, private

One person living alone or a group of persons (who may or may not be related) living at the same address with common housekeeper, including any person staying temporarily with the household and not resident in Guernsey, Herm, Jethou or Lihou.

Communal establishment

An establishment such as an hotel, boarding school, hospital or residential home, in which some form of communal catering is provided.

Visitor

A person normally resident outside Guernsey, Herm, Jethou or Lihou, not working or seeking work in the Islands, and visiting the Islands for less than a month.

Resident

A person not being a visitor.

Economically active population

All persons, being part of the resident population and aged fifteen or over, either in employment (including self-employment), whether full or part-time, whether temporary or permanent, at any time in the week prior to 23 March, or unemployed during the period but seeking work or waiting to take up a job (including persons temporarily in ill health).

Economically inactive population

All persons, being part of the resident population, not classified as economically active.

APPENDIX 2

CENSUS 1986

COMMENTARY

INTRODUCTION

The States resolved on 30th January 1985 to establish a permanent committee called the Population and Migration Committee whose mandate includes the responsibility for a periodic Census of Population.

The Census conducted on 23rd March, 1986 was the second quinquennial Census; the first being held on 25th April, 1976. The first quinquennial Census differed in a number of respects from previous decennial Censuses in the type of questions asked and the analysis performed. Decennial Censuses provide standard trend figures on population, household arrangements and sewerage, whereas quinquennial censuses provide opportunities for asking (as was the case in 1976) about such things as domestic appliances and where cars are parked at nights.

RESIDENT POPULATION

In both the 1976 Census and 1981 Census the term 'resident population' was taken to comprise all persons normally resident in Guernsey, Herm or Jethou at midnight on Census Day whether or not they were actually present in the Islands at that time. Census Day in 1986 was March 23rd.

It is considered that with the importance of tourism and the greater mobility of the population the 'resident population' is a more relevant statistic than that of the 'Census night population'.

In 1986, the Census was conducted the week before Easter which fell on 30 March. The early Easter meant that the Census was conducted some 3 to 4 weeks before its usual mid April date and one week before Easter rather than two weeks before Easter. Unusually the schools had broken up on the Friday before the Census and a number of children and parents were absent on holiday on Census night. The majority of these persons were required to complete a Census form on their return to Guernsey.

The 'resident population' was found to be 55,482 persons an increase of 2,169 over 1981. Of this 2,154 is due to net migration and 15 to natural increase.

The net migration is of the order of that experienced in previous intercensal periods. The natural increase (births over deaths) has decreased with intercensal periods

ECONOMIC ACTIVITY

The economically active are those persons over school leaving age who were in employment during the week before the Census and those who though intending to work were out of employment (including those who were out of employment because of sickness) at the time of the Census.

The economically inactive include those who were not in employment at the time of the Census nor intending to get work, even though they worked regularly at other times of the year, for example, in shops at Christmas time. People at school or university during term time were excluded even if they did paid work during the holidays, weekends or other free time.

Economically Active by Age

The economically active have increased from 49.5% to 50.0% of the population. The overall trend includes an increase in the 15 to 64 age group and a decrease in the 65 plus age group.

ECONOMIC ACTIVITY BY SEX

Male economic activity in 1976, 1981 and 1986 has changed little in total though in 1981 many unemployed men were classified as economically active. The increase in male population from 25,701 to 26,859 in 1986 has been accompanied by an increase in economically inactive males from 9,615 in 1981 to 10,742 in 1986. More detailed examination reveals that this increase has been spread over the whole 15 to 65 age range.

Female economic activity has continued to increase. Of the 11,602 economically active, 2,765 are part time (20 hours or less) and 8,837 are full time (55% of the male economically active). The increase in female population from 27,612 in 1981 to 28,623 in 1986 is slightly less than the increase in female economic activity.

Employment by Industry

Below is a comparison of employment by economic sectors for the last four censuses. Each census has used a different method of judging each person's economic sector and occupation. This makes comparison difficult. The 1986 Census was coded using the S.I.C. (Standard Industrial Classification) of the UK Censuses. These S.I.C. codes were translated to the Guernsey categories used in previous Censuses. In spite of these difficulties, some trends and comparisons can be derived.

Comparisons of economic sector of employment from 1981 to 1986 in the table below shows:-

- a) a near 50% increase in banking and insurance jobs since 1981,
- b) a 23% decline in horticultural jobs since 1981, which is no longer the main provider of jobs,
- c) relatively static employment in manufacturing and tourism,
- d) small increases in construction and distribution/sales/wholesaling /retailing jobs since 1981,
- e) a large increase in service jobs, both professional and other.

Prior to undertaking the 1986 Census, some considerable time was spent in the preparation of background information relating to dwellings constructed since the date of the 1981 Census. Records in the Cadastre Department gave an indication of where new units of accommodation should be found. The "New Dwellings" figures do not equate with the "Census Increase 1986/1981" figures as dwellings which have been derelict or undergoing major renovation are not shown as first time entrants on the Cadastre records when re-assessed and ready for occupation. Likewise conversions are also not entered as "New Dwellings". The difference between Increase 1986/1981 and Cadastre new dwellings is an indication of conversion by Parish.

The average number of persons per household is 2.71 compared to 2.76 for 1981 and 2.88 for 1976. The average number of persons per room in private households was 0.46 compared to 0.49 in 1981 and 0.52 in 1976.

The number of persons per household is highest for rented States accommodation and lowest for rented furnished accommodation and unfurnished accommodation. Open Market houses fall in between at 2.60 persons.

TENURE

The proportion of home ownership continues to rise. By 1986, 69.2% of households were owner occupied compared with 59.9% in 1971, 63.5% in 1976 and 65.7% in 1981. There is a comparable decline in furnished and unfurnished rents.

Cars

The number of cars available for domestic use increased from 21,650 in 1981 (19,147 in 1976) to 25,981 in 1986. An increase of 4,331 cars or 20%.

While the number of households with no car fell from 22.8% to 18.8%, the number of two car households rose from 23.8% to 28.5% of the total. 37.7% of households have two or more cars in 1986 compared to 30.0% in 1981 - an increase of 1,779 households with two or more cars (7389 households in all).

Parish trends show a major increase in the number of households in St Peter Port and the Vale with an available car.

MIGRATION

During the intercensal period 1981-86 the number of persons taking up residence from outside Guernsey was 4,813. If the number of births is added to these newcomers, the total persons taking up residence is 7,919. Since the increase in resident population was 2,169 and since the excess of births over deaths was 15, the number of persons leaving the Island during 1981-86 can be estimated at 2,659.

The immigrant totals include both persons setting up here permanently in Guernsey and short stay immigrants. Immigration studies show that annually about 1,100 persons come to Guernsey to work and leave within the same calendar year, a further 300 come to Guernsey and work for between 1 and 4 years. A further 600 come and stay for 5 years or more. The Census is a snapshot of this fluid situation.

The table below shows estimates of net migration, immigration, emigration and persons taking residence for the period 1956 onwards. Due to the different questions and analyses used in previous Censuses, different methods have been used to derive the estimates.

Broad conclusions are:-

- a) there were 2,154 net migrants from 1981 to 1986,
- b) the number of net migrants were of the same order as during the periods

1961-65, 1966-70 and 1971-75, but not the same as 1976-80,

- c) intercensal immigration from 1981 to 1986 was estimated as 4,813 - a figure comparable to the previous five year period,
- d) intercensal emigration was estimated at 2,659 for the 1981 - 86 period. This is about half that of the two previous periods 1971 - 76 and 1976 - 81 but similar to that of the period 1966 to 1971,
- e) it follows that the net migration of 1981 to 1985 arises from a lower rate of emigration rather than a higher rate of immigration.

PLACE OF BIRTH OF RESIDENTS

After Guernsey, the U.K. is the next most common place of birth with 15,838 of the resident population (28.5%). Guernsey accounts for 65.8% so leaving 5.7% for non U.K. persons, such as other EEC members.

Examination by country of birth of persons taking up residence 1980-86 - that is quite recently - shows the U.K. as a major source of immigrants.

Some idea of intercensal residency can be gained by comparing:-

- a) those last taking up residence for each of the years, 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979, and 1980 as given in the 1981 Census,
- b) those last taking up residence for each of the years, 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979, and 1980 as given in the 1986 Census.

The table below shows that

- a) overall five years later some 38% of the five year period immigrants have departed,
- b) some 51% of the most recent year (1980) immigrants have departed,
- c) some 38% of the 2, 3 or 4 year immigrants have departed,
- d) some 21% of the 5 year immigrants have departed.

CHANGES IN AGE DISTRIBUTION

A comparison of five year age groups between 1981 and 1986 reveals the net migration which has occurred. e.g. with no migration it could be expected that all aged, say, 10 - 14, would be aged 15 - 19 in five years time.

The age group 30 to 39 has gained more than other age groups, even though most immigrants are in the age group 20-29. This is because most emigrants are also aged 20-29 and there is a smaller net gain of 20-29 year olds.

Of the 4,813 new residents, 1,427 (30%) were aged between 20 and 29 at the time of the 1986 Census, while 1,073 (22%) were aged between 30 and 39.

Of the 2,659 leaving, 1,270 (48%) were estimated to be aged between 20 and 29, while 516 (19%) were aged between 30 and 39.

The different rates of immigration and emigration has meant that the main increase in population is of those aged 30 - 39 (559 of the 2,154 or 26%).

More females than males take up residence across the ages 15 to 40, but more females than males also emigrate. Overall the net migration of both sexes is about the same.

Below is shown the gain in males and females of various ages over the intercensal period 1981-86.

Further age groupings are highly affected by mortality and are therefore not included. Male mortality is higher than female mortality on an age for age basis.

The actual rates of immigration and emigration of the 1981-86 intercensal period are shown below. Those who come and go during this period will not be detected by a census and cannot be included.

ECONOMIC SECTOR OF THOSE TAKING UP RESIDENCE

A total 2,864 economically active persons took up residence between 1981 and 1985. Finance was the largest economic sector with 636; followed by accommodation with 540 and total public (public plus education plus health) with 536. However, employees in accommodation are much more likely to depart from Guernsey within the year and most cannot be considered long term residents. Only 250 persons in accommodation took up residence from 1976 to 1980 and were still in Guernsey in 1986, (compared to 540 from 1981 - 1986). The finance sector was an important source of jobs from 1976 - 80 with 383 as was the total public sector with 460.

Persons taking up residence from 1976 to 1985 and working were concentrated in finance, public and accommodation rather than being spread over all sectors of the economy.

QUALIFICATIONS

The more common qualifications of Guernsey residents are those of education and nursing. City and Guild qualifications for various trades are also common. Nearly 600 persons possess a degree.

The Enumerator may have to ask you some questions to enable him or her to complete the Enumerator Section of the form, or to check that you have filled in your section of the form correctly.

Please note that a household means either one person living alone, or a group of persons, related or unrelated, living at the same address and sharing housekeeping arrangements. Visitors to the Census Area who are staying temporarily with the household should be included on the Census form.

Complete a column for every person who usually lives in the household whether or not they are related to you and regardless of whether or not they actually spend Census night in the household. Include full-time students who may be away from home (say, at college in the United Kingdom) as persons who usually live in the household. Also complete a column for any visitor to the Census Area who spends Census night in the household.

You do not have to complete a column for a person (say, a babysitter) who spends Census night in the Household but who usually lives elsewhere in the Census Area. Such persons will be enumerated by the head of the household in which they usually live.

The information you give on the form will be treated as CONFIDENTIAL and used only for compiling statistics. Please be assured that NO information about named persons will be passed by the Census staff to any other person. If anyone involved in the Census discloses information which you provide, he or she will be liable to prosecution. Similarly, information which anyone (for example, a lodger) gives you to enable you to complete the form must not be disclosed by you in any other way.

There is a legal obligation to complete this form and failure to comply with the requirements described above, or the inclusion of false information may incur penalties.

The legal obligation to fill in the whole form rests on YOU, but each person who has to be included is required to give you the information you need. However, anyone who wishes can ask the Enumerator or the Census Office for a Personal Form which can be returned either to the Enumerator or direct to the Census Office.

When you have completed the form, will you please ensure that you sign the declaration on the last page.
